Monroe City Return to Learn 2020 FAQs

How is close contact defined?

Close contact is defined as being within 6 feet of a person for a period of 15 minutes while the person is exhibiting symptoms or two days prior to the person becoming symptomatic. If contact tracing is necessary parents will be notified.

Will my kids be health screened at school?

Yes. Students will be temperature checked upon arrival. <u>Parents must also make every effort to prescreen students before you send your child to school.</u>

What will food service look like?

- Breakfast will be grab-and-go. Elementary students will eat in their classroom.
 Middle school students will eat in the middle school.
- Lunch will be pre-packaged in a biodegradable container. No a la carte options. Students will be assigned seats in case contact tracing is necessary. Students will be allowed to bring their own lunch. No microwaves available for use.

Will students have access to water fountains?

No. Students are allowed to bring in their own personal water bottle. The district will be installing water filling stations. Bottled water will be provided until the stations are installed.

How will arrival time be handled?

Students will not be allowed in the buildings until 7:45 A.M.

- -Elementary: Students will report immediately to their homeroom classroom.
- -Middle School: Students will report to the gym and be seated by homeroom/1st hr class.
- -High School: Students will report to their first hour class.

What will recess look like in elementary?

Due to construction, students will use the former practice football field. This location was chosen for its large area. Recess may be shorter in duration and more frequent than in the past.

What will the classroom setting look like?

Students will have assigned seats. Seats will be spread out as far as practicable.

What will cleaning and sanitation look like?

Custodial staff are receiving extensive training in sanitation processes through Hillyards, our cleaning supply distributor.
